Position Purpose

Speech Pathologists at Western Health Bacchus Marsh and Melton fulfil a diverse role within the service. This role works within our Integrated Community Health Services at Melton and Bacchus Marsh delivering services across a variety of funding streams, including CHSP, HACC, NDIS and Support at Home Packages. There is also opportunity to support inpatient care to patients at Bacchus Marsh Hospital. The role will be responsible for assessment and ongoing management of swallowing and communication impairments in line with evidence-based practice and patient centred approach via one on one and groups based models. The role works as part of the multidisciplinary team to provide a coordinated approach to patient care. The role will be supervised by a Grade 2 Speech Pathologist.

Business Unit Overview

The Operations Directorate is one of the largest and most complex directorates within Western Health providing Western Health's patient care and contacts. These services range from outpatients to inpatients, theatres to Intensive Care, birthing rooms and Emergency Departments and many more services.

Integrated Community Health Service Directorate

The Integrated Community Health Services Directorate at Western Health focuses on delivering high quality evidence based care to those residing in the City of Melton and Moorabool Shire across a variety of clinical settings. The predominant focus of Allied Health is the return and optimisation of an individual's function, and wellbeing, from both physical and psycho-social perspectives. Allied Health involvement is pivotal to efficient and effective multidisciplinary team functions, discharge planning and patient centred care. Key Responsibilities

- Provide centre and home-based clinical speech pathology services to patients attending the Community Services program in the form of assessment, intervention, management and promotion of self-management.
- Have a sound knowledge around various aspects of speech pathology management using evidence-based practice.
- Ensure that all service delivery and program development has an evidence-based framework, based upon program resource guidelines where available.
- Support the development of group programs and conduct groups as required.
- Utilise agreed practice standards for patient outcomes within organisational procedures.
- Maintain close professional working relationships with other health professionals and support personnel.
- Maintain an up to date knowledge and skills base to facilitate best possible patient care
- Provide education and act as a resource to other staff, patients, community groups and other agencies as appropriate to the role.
- Maintain statistics in accordance with Western Health requirement.
- Participate and support service development, organisational meetings, staff development and training as required
- Ensure that all equipment and resources are regularly monitored and maintained according to departmental guidelines.
- Assist the Manager of the area with other duties as required.

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- Ensure all documentation is maintained in the standard manner when required.
- Be aware of and participate in quality and risk management programs.
- Participate in staff development activities.
- Utilise appropriate communication channels as per organisational structure.
- Identify patient needs and provide appropriate patient information with consideration for health literacy principles.
- Act in accordance with standards, guidelines and mandatory training.
